Since joining Jobe, Clara has earned straight A's each semester while holding multiple positions of leadership within her sorority. She has attended multiple conferences centered around personal and professional development. Clara is even on track to graduate with honors this coming May with a bachelor's degree in Child Development. Being that she is a first-generation college

student, this will be a huge accomplishment. Having achieved academic success, Clara now wants to continue her education. She is currently applying for graduate school to pursue a master's degree in Student Affairs.

"I've had a difficult academic journey navigating through college as a first-generation student. When I transferred to CSUN, I experienced heavy burnout and stress due to personal and family issues. Being a part of JOBE has brought me a sense of relief and stability. After years of navigating through my college journey alone, I now have a support system that can provide me with the resources I need and an ear to listen. Through their support, I've continued to be a straight-A student as I continue to improve my mental well-being. I'll be graduating from CSUN with a 3.9 GPA, the highest GPA I've had throughout all my years in school. I'm grateful JOBE has given me a chance to finish strong for my last years of college."

With stability and support from Jobe, Erick was able to intern at Los Angeles International Airport, where he gained valuable work experience and added to his professional network. With his newfound passion for the tourism industry and his academic achievements, Erick is now interested in attending graduate school to further his education and make himself a more marketable

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candidate for his future endeavors. He will graduate with a bachelor's degree from CSUN this May and would like to pursue a master's degree in Diverse Community Development Leadership.

"For someone like me, going to college almost seemed unrealistic. And in all honesty, if it weren't for the Jobe program I'm not sure that I would have gotten through this journey as successfully as I have. Being part of the program truly helped me through my academic journey. You can clearly see the impact of this program through my transcripts. Prior to joining I was performing minimally with grades like C's and B's. Every semester since I joined the program, I have managed to make the Dean's List. It's a supportive environment that gives you the tools you need to succeed. They really pushed me to step out of my comfort zone and tap into resources I never knew existed. Now, as a senior, I'm even applying to graduate school! That never would have been on my radar without this program. I'm forever grateful for the impact it's had on my life."

He is eager to enhance his skills and develop a professional network by completing internships and earning additional certifications beyond his regular coursework. Donta is on track to graduate this May and has also



considered advancing his education by attending graduate school. He would like pursue a master's degree in Entertainment Industry Management.

"Joining JOBE, at first, was an endeavor in which I had no idea what I was getting myself into. The program was highly regarded by a close friend of mine so I took their word and here we are! Four months later, and I have seen a complete 180 in my grades and an upward trajectory in my professional career. I am now working my second internship/professional development job in digital marketing and went from a 2.6 GPA last year at CSUN to a 3.6 this previous fall semester. Jobe has been a beacon of hope in my life that has allowed me to secure professional and academic development and growth that I hope to leverage into a high-paying job when I transition out of the program."
